<u>Financials</u>, Mahoney, See Exhibit B provided through email in advance of the meeting. The operating expenses are down slightly down due to the closed museum and inability to obtain sponsors for ticketing. This was anticipated. Grant from the state is referenced. Operating costs show an increase due to the physical costs of moving from the museum into storage or return of artifacts. Annotation of disposition of assets and total amount written off.

Regarding the sunset audit, when the Hall become under the administration of TDTD no longer have annual audits, but the Hall is lumped into the sunset audit of the department. The audit has gone smooth but an item that has been pointed out is the need to have directors sign a conflict-of-interest statement. Working on a plan to put together for compliance. Will go into more detail when go over the budget later in the agenda.

<u>Public Comment</u>, Willis, Have two (2) individuals here to speak on behalf of at-large candidates for consideration for induction. Both afforded five (5) minutes to speak:

William Brown, for Bob Brown, worked as a teacher for Johnson City area – regards to basketball at ETSU, only player to average a double, double for the entire season. Let the OBC in two major categories. 20 rebounds per game, 74% of FG – one of the highest numbers ever. Hamilton Co. recognized for teacher of the year as well as during his time teaching in Memphis. Within past year inducted in October 2023 was inducted into the European basketball HOF.

Tully Noe, for Phillip Clark, West TN candidate PC long time HS baseball coach. Touch on high points known for 65 years and grew up together. Clark has done a lot for Bartlett as a city; unmatched what he has done for his community. He had many opportunities to move but

wanted to stay in the public school system to be a coach and mentor. He has been inducted in the TSSAA HOF.

 - i. Mahoney, Explained that there are two (2) budgets; one single budget but then Profit and Loss along with Capital Campaign Budget. The Capital Campaign is abstract with a million-dollar fundraising goal. Will be other agreements beyond 1220. Wanted to build in funds for events to provide materials and solicit donations.
 - ii. Willis, Appreciate Sparks, Mahoney and Groomes this is a different budget and one with no museum to account for and grant dollars beneficial to the organization. The Capital Campaign will be a heavy focus for the next two (2) years.
 - iii. Ezell, This set-up allows for planning and adjustments during the year. Call for unique about of flexibility without giving up control or accountability.
 - iv. Motion, Ezell, Approve both budgets as constructed with approval and acknowledgement that Exec and Sparks working with Tourist Development have ability to make changes upon those groups requesting. Second from Sparks. Table to Executive Director Compensation.
 - b. Executive Director Compensation
 - i. Salary, Ezell, Not done a comparative study but now Willis is taking on his normal responsibilities but also a capital campaign. Sense is that Willis puts in a lot of hours and does a great job, is extremely accountable and loves the ability to fulfill his role with the Titans. Any discussion?  performance component that could be an Amendment to Willis'
 contract. This can be done in conjunction with the statutory
 requirement of the Commissioner's performance evaluation.






